

## IAA CLE FINANCIAL HARDSHIP POLICY AND APPLICATION

The Investment Adviser Association (IAA) offers financial aid for certain attorneys who wish to attend an IAA program but for whom the registration fee would be a financial hardship due to loss of employment or similar circumstances. This policy applies only to attorneys who are seeking continuing legal education (CLE) in a state in which the IAA is a CLE provider and that requires CLE providers to have a financial hardship policy. See **Exhibit A** for a current list of states.

Attorneys who are seeking CLE in these states and who qualify for a financial hardship fee waiver will receive a 50% reduction of the registration fee for programs costing over \$500 and a 25% reduction of the registration fee for programs costing less than \$500. The IAA does not reduce the costs of meals, lodging, or travel associated with its programs.

#### Illinois

Pursuant to the Minimum Continuing Legal Education Board of the Supreme Court of Illinois, FAQ, What must a provider include in its financial hardship policy?, the IAA has a financial hardship policy for any program where Illinois attorneys must pay to attend, or the employers or other third parties pay for Illinois attorneys to attend.
